- Most of the students belong to rural community and are less interested to participate in various academic activities they are having shy nature.

- The department has an opportunity to extends its social work among rural community,
- The department has an opportunity to start post-graduation

program in sociology as the subject is demanding among the students,

- The department has an opportunity to collaborate with UNICEF and other local, national and state level NGOs for extension activities,
- To create awareness about various social problems among the students and the society and
- To participate in welfare activities.
